Whilst on a recent run I found myself running around marine lake. I spotted a stick on the floor, not an unusual occurrence, but this stick was different. It looked exactly like stick man. For those of you who don't know who stick man is please look it up. Gwilym loves stick man and I thought about stopping to pick it up, but in my indecision and want to carry on with my run at my speed I left it behind. With every step I took away from stick man I felt guilty for not stopping. I was so convicted that I turned around, lost time and picked up the stick, proceeding to carry it for the next 4 miles. I got lots of funny looks but the look on Gwilym's face when I gave him stick man made it all worthwhile. I worry that in the busyness of our lives, we become so focussed on our own journey and agenda that we miss so much. We miss glimpses of God's glory and we miss God given opportunities to help others and show them Jesus.

Just last week we considered the journey of Moses. In Exodus 3 we read of Moses in the wilderness, doing what He has been doing for the last 40 years, wandering and shepherding. Moses spots a bush on fire but not burning up which presents him with a decision. Does he stick with the everyday, his own agenda, what he's always done or does he break from the ordinary? *'Moses thought "I will go over and see this strange sight" ... When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to Him...' Ex 3:3-4.* Notice that the Lord showed himself through the bush and waited for Moses to respond. When Moses did approach God called him by name, God knew Him and had a glorious message and purpose for Him. God reveals himself in the everyday and God has a glorious purpose for each one of us. The question is, will we break from our own path and allow God to speak? Are we willing to lay down our own agenda and allow God to lead us on a greater adventure? Pastor Ben.
